

Very Brief Book Prospectus. The workshop is only concerned with content, so a one-page draft table of contents is requested to help the *lotsen* make inferences about how the book project expands from the signal chapter/article used for the workshop. The below is provided as a set of suggestions that would help the Press editor explain the book project to colleagues at the Press.

1. **Proposed Title and Subtitle**
2. **Brief Description** - In one page, please explain the purpose, thesis, approach, methods & data used, and general plan of the book.
3. **Chapter Outline** – Please provide an annotated table of contents, including proposed chapter titles and a brief paragraph describing the contents of each chapter. This gives everyone an idea of how the material fits together, and how the chapters will be developed. This should include chapter headings and sub-headings, with explanations as necessary. Please note whether (and where) any of the chapters or have been published previously or will draw on previously published work.
4. **Related works** – Please list a few titles (just a list by author and title/subtitle) that you see as closely related to yours.
5. **Readership** – What do you see as the main market for the book? Scholarly, professional, graduate text, reference, crossover, full trade? If this is a text, for what course is the book intended? Please list disciplines and subfields as appropriate. Whatever your answer, please consider carefully the approach, terminology, level of explanation, evidence, and scholarly apparatus that your book will need to make it most compelling and useful for your intended reader.
6. **Status of the Work** - Do you have a timetable for completing the book? And what do you estimate to be the size of the completed book (in words)?
